Dear Minister Hindley,

On behalf of [Neighbourhood Pharmacy Association of Canada \(Neighbourhood Pharmacies\)](http://neighbourhoodpharmacies.ca), I would like to congratulate you on your recent appointment as Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, Seniors and Rural and Remote Health for the province of Saskatchewan.

Neighbourhood Pharmacies represents Canada's leading pharmacy organizations, including chain, banner, long-term care, specialty pharmacies, grocery chains, and mass merchandisers with pharmacies. We seek to advance healthcare for Canadians by leveraging close to 11,000 pharmacies conveniently located in communities throughout the country as integral points of patient care. We are focused on the business of community pharmacies, and work to ensure that our members can continue to deliver the convenient, professional patient care, products and service. The economic footprint of the pharmacy sector in Saskatchewan is estimated at over \$558 million in GDP and 8,300 jobs. Our commitment to our communities and to our patients is repaid in trust, as 80 per cent of Canadians consult their pharmacists for professional healthcare, at nearly 400 community pharmacies across the province. In our role as an advocate for our members, we strive to develop and offer innovative solutions to help advance needed change in the healthcare delivery system.

Pharmacies work collaboratively with their patients and with other healthcare providers to prevent admissions to hospital, prevent premature admissions into long-term care, help patients transition back into community after hospital discharge, and maximize the time patients can live independently in their homes. Improved transitions between the community and hospital will help patients retain and regain independence and reduce the number of hospital readmissions, and help ensure people get the right healthcare, from the right providers, at the right time, and in the right location.

During the current COVID-19 pandemic, we are proud of the role pharmacies have played in supporting the healthcare system and are well positioned to provide more assistance should it be needed or required. During this crisis, pharmacies have been happy to play their part in managing the increased healthcare needs of their patients and customers when patients had reduced access to their physicians. As a result of ability to prescribe treatments for common ailments, pharmacies have contributed to decreasing physician visits, which can take up to 10-20 per cent of physicians' time and decreased the pressures on an already strained system. We continue to offer our support to do more, including an expanded role in immunizations beyond flu, including pneumonia, COVID-19, and other routine child and adult immunizations.

Further, given the recent increase in opioid crisis related deaths within the province, our Association would appreciate the opportunity to elaborate further on the impact pharmacists have with opioid management and how pharmacies can provide expanded support for the opioid crisis through naloxone programs; including a discussion on supporting a Section 56 exemption in the federal Controlled Drugs and Substances Act to enable all qualified Canadian pharmacists to prescribe without the need for circumstantial exemptions.

We work closely with the Pharmacy Association of Saskatchewan (PAS) and are aligned on the critical role that pharmacies and pharmacists can play in supporting the Public Health response and recovery as well as the economic recovery in Saskatchewan. A strong and sustainable pharmacy sector underlie the sector's ability to continue to drive value for the health system and to be an accessible and reliable healthcare destination for residents of Saskatchewan.

We would welcome the opportunity to meet with you, in collaboration with our provincial partners at PAS, and discuss how community pharmacies can assist the province in its delivery of quality healthcare to its residents.
